

Chairman Emeritus Was 89

Michael O'Brien, Banker, Is Dead

Michael C. O'Brien, 89, for many years a banking figure in Marion, died this morning in Marion Manor.

A past president of Fahey Banking Co., he was at the time of his death, chairman emeritus of the 106-year old financial firm.

The founder of the bank, Timothy Fahey, was the grandfather of both Mr. O'Brien and his successor and present chairman of the board and chief execu-

tive officer, Francis B. Huber. President from 1932 to 1955, Mr. O'Brien became chairman of the board of directors, then last year, chairman emeritus.

Born in July 1882, in Toledo, he was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael O'Brien. He had been a cashier and vice president of the banking company preceding his promotion to president.

A member of St. Mary Church, he was a member of the local Council 671, Knights of Columbus, for nearly 70 years, Msgr. Joseph M. Denning Assembly, 4th Degree, more than 60 years and Elks Lodge more than 50 years. He had been associated with Marion YMCA well over 60 years.

Surviving with Mr. Huber are other cousins here.

Four sisters and a brother preceded Mr. O'Brien in death.
